Islay and Jura Marketing Group has received a total of £32,200 in funding from VisitScotland since March 2020 to the date of your request for this information. This consists of a sponsorship grant of £600 for their tourism summit and three Covid grants totalling £31,600. The table below details the individual payments and when they were paid.
